COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This foundational course introduces IT professionals and system administrators to the essential skills required for setting up and managing the latest Windows Server operating systems through practical, project-based learning. Participants will build a basic Active Directory (AD) environment and configure a file server using Hyper-V, focusing project work that underscores key server infrastructure management practices and hybrid environment concepts. This course offers a hands-on approach to learning essential management practices, while preparing participants for the AZ-800 exam and laying a solid groundwork in server administration.
