Updated Summer 2024

This template has been developed by referencing the Uniform Articulation Agreement (UAA) between the University of North Carolina RN to BSN programs and the North Carolina Community College System Associate Degree Nursing programs and the RN to BSN requirements on the websites of the four-year universities. Indicated below are the stated requirements for those institutions within the restrictions defined by the UAA. In order to be eligible, students must have and earn an AAS with a GPA of at least 2.0 and a grade of C or better in all RN to BSN classes.

Block 1 consists of certain prerequisite nursing courses that are taken as a part of all North Carolina community college AAS nursing programs.

Block II consists of additional general education requirements that are not a part of an AAS degree but are required to earn a BSN.
